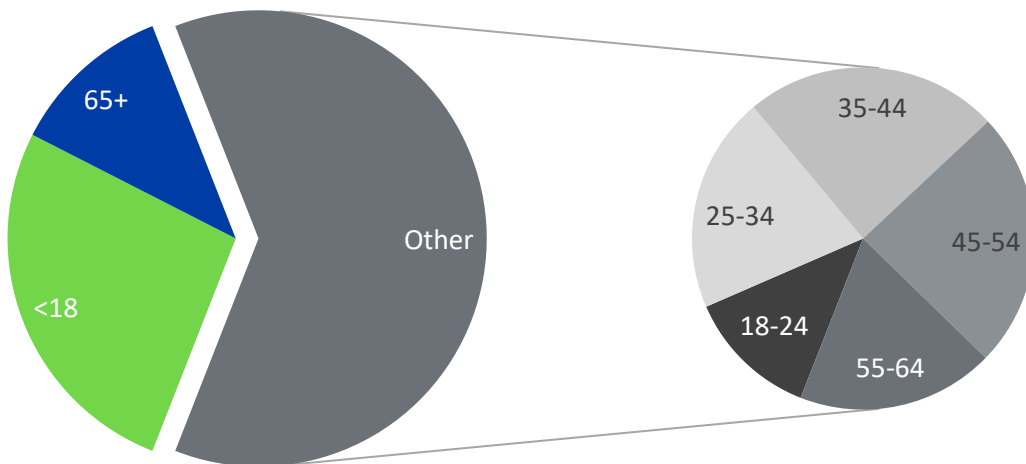

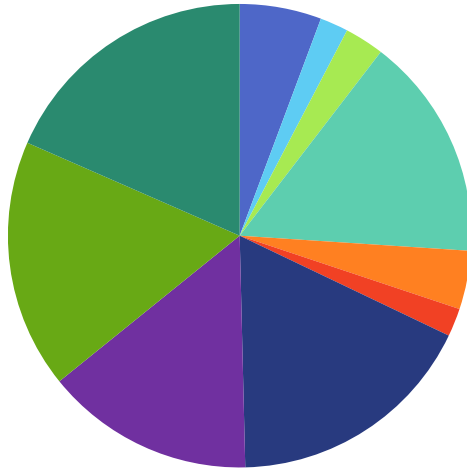

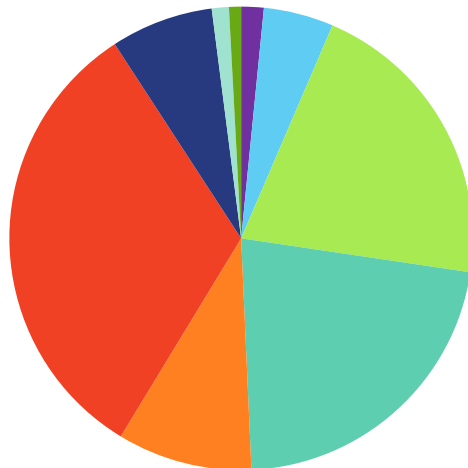

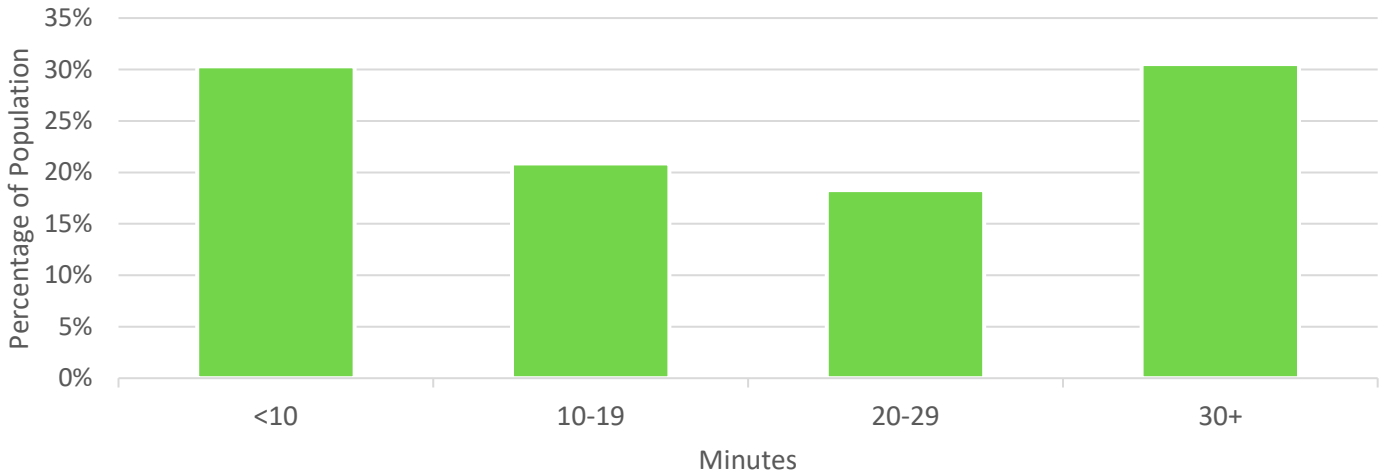
EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Maximum level of education for county residents age 25+



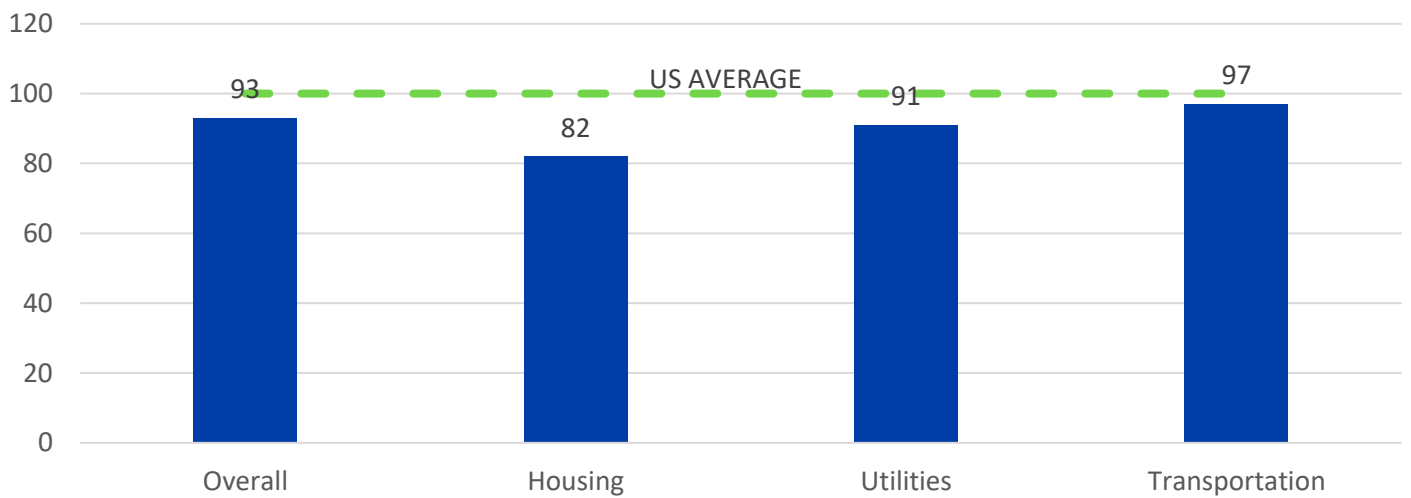
